A person-centered assessment, care plan, and supports coordination for people in need of nursing facility level of care. No financial eligibility is required. Donations and cost sharing are encouraged.

Case Coordination and Support

6,184 people served/33,689 hours

Assistance provided to older adults to determine necessary supports, and subsequent linking to and coordination of services to meet their needs.

Information & Assistance

8,862 people served/3,851.25 hours

AIRS Certified Information & Assistance specialists help people connect to programs and services available within the aging network as well as community resources.

Medicare & Medicaid Assistance Program (MMAP)

7.259 clients

Volunteers and paid staff throughout the Region VII AAA planning and service area assist people with Medicare and Medicaid questions, review plan options and help older adults determine if they are eligible for extra help paying premiums and prescription drug costs.

MI Choice Home and Community-based Waiver

1,153 people served/1,104,885 hours

Provides home and community-based services and supports to people age 65 and older as well as to adults with disabilities who meet Medicaid's Nursing Facility Level of Care and financial criteria.

Advocacy and Outreach

1,983 people served/5,817.50 hours

Agency-wide efforts to identify, connect and assist older adult minority populations including the economically disadvantaged, disabled or members of a minority.

Transportation

280 people served/25,543.40 hours

Provides rides to doctor appointments and related healthcare as well as routine errands including grocery shopping.

Adult Day Care

114people served/43,090. 75hours

Funding supports programs in the community that provide social and rehabilitative activities.

Caregiver Supplemental Services

194 people served/198 hours

Provides goods and services for caregivers when needs cannot be met by traditional funding sources or other community programs.

Caregiver Training

665 people served/4,425 hours

Provides education for family caregivers on topics including dementia, homemaking and personal care.

Elder Abuse Prevention

1,602 people served/1,385.25 hours

Outreach and education designed to prevent self-neglect, abuse, and financial exploitation of older adults.

Evidence-based Programs

309 enrollees/290 completers

Research-based workshops designed to improve health or manage a chronic health condition.

Home Repair

96 people served/2,258.25 hours

Uses funding to make repairs necessary to keep home safe for the older adult.

Kinship Outreach and Support

59 people served/85 hours

Material support and programs for adults age 55 and older who are raising a relative's child.

Legal Services

1009 people served/3,846.15 hours

Provides legal assistance and referrals to attorneys on civil matters that impact older adults.

Provides funding to support the wages of senior center staff.

Slip/Fall Safety

501 people served/875 hours

Provides funding for elderly homeowners who have a special need for home modification so they can continue living independently.

Utility Assistance

47 people served/52 hours

Utility assistance for people who have exhausted all other sources of funding.

Veteran Self-Directed and Community-based Services

8 people served/15,491 hours

Homemaking

1,306 people served/40,082 hours

Housekeeping, meal preparation, and laundry service for people who are unable to do it on their own.

Home-delivered Meals

9,293 people served/774,117 meals served

Provides a hot and nutritious meal typically delivered at noon to the home-bound older adult.

Congregate Nutrition

4,187 people served/232,337 meals served

Provides a hot, nutritious meal served in a group setting, often with social activity and fellowship.

Personal Care

450 people served/20,573 hours

Assistance with bathing, dressing and grooming.

Respite

231 people served/17,511 hours

Funds a temporary caregiver as a relief to the primary caregiver.

TSR Respite

37 people served/5,660 hours

Funds a temporary caregiver as a relief to the primary caregiver using *Tobacco Settlement* funds.

Unmet Needs/Chore Services

31 people served/40 hours

Uses funding to provide non-continuous maintenance tasks as a way of reducing the risk of injury to the older adult.
