




The MI Choice Waiver program is for people who are:

- Eligible for Medicaid
  - Region VII AAA can help with the application
- Meet nursing facility level of care (based on state-required assessment)
- Age 65 or older, or
- Age 18 to 64 with a disability

# MI Choice Michigan's Medicaid Home and Community Based Waiver

MI Choice and Region VII AAA help older adults and persons with disabilities remain independent in the home of their choice.

# Why MI Choice

MI Choice provides help in the home or community for people who would otherwise need to live in a nursing home. The program coordinates services and supports needed for people to live in the home of their choice and do things they enjoy in the community.

Participants, with assistance from Region VII staff, develop a personcentered service plan that caregivers and others follow based on how participants want their services to be provided. Participants may choose either an agency to provide caregivers, or select the self-determination option that allows them to hire their own caregivers.



### How it works



A Registered Nurse and/or a licensed Social Worker will visit and do an assessment of your physical, social, and emotional needs. They will ask questions about where you live, or where you plan to live if you are in a nursing home. They will want to know about your financial situation, medications you take, and if there are friends or family who are available to help you maintain your home or assist with your personal needs.

Participants of the Medicaid MI Choice Waiver receive follow-up phone calls on a routine basis and re-assessments on regular intervals. Should a change in a participant's care needs occur, services can be adjusted to ensure their needs are met.

## The MI Choice Waiver offers

- participation in an adult day program
  - chore services
- community living supports
- short-term, limited counseling services
- goods and services
- home modifications/accessibility items
- fiscal intermediary services (for those who choose to hire their own staff)
- home-delivered meals
- transportation (non-medical as well as healthcare related rides)
- personal emergency response system
- private duty nursing and respiratory care
- respite (in or out of home)
- specialized medical equipment/supplies
- supports coordination
- training
- nursing services (for monitoring of health conditions)

# Is the MI Choice Waiver right for you?

A nurse from Region VII Area Agency on Aging will review your referral and determine if you appear to meet the program requirements. If it appears that you may be eligible, an in-home assessment will be scheduled at a time convenient for you.
